## **County Lines**

- Trident is an arm of the London Met Police focusing on gang related crime. There are three teams: proactive, reactive and engagement. Peter is part of the engagement team and work primarily with young people to steer away, support and engage away from gang life.
- With a national reduction of youth services, the need for partner to support in this work, including churches is becoming essential.
- 'County Lines' is the practice of gangs to entrap children and young people in carrying drugs from the city to surrounding counties. It is a type of drug dealing that is organised around mobile phone selling (the 'Lines' is a reference to phone lines).
- Vulnerable children and young people are targeted, tracked, lured, entrapped, blackmailed and threatened. It is a cycle of intimidation and destruction that escalates to trap young people in dealing class A drugs.
- Trident are working now to help educate communities in being better equipped to identify the signs and indicators of children and young people who may be caught in County Lines. Children's Society as an organisation are working for the benefit of the most vulnerable young people, and so are looking for ways to support and help engage churches to attend to this growing need.
- Steve Clarke and Jess Swift will plan a similar session open to the whole deanery for those in our churches working with young people.
