Mark (ADDO) and Rob (St Mellitus tutor) shared something of how our diocese and the national church are re-evaluating the vocations process and asking questions about whether there are barriers to diversity. Capital Vision 2020 had an objective to raise vocations, which has been achieved but the challenge remains if the church is going to fill the gap left by the current cohort of clergy who are retiring. We were left with the challenge to have a vocations conversation once a month.
